The Independence Sinfonia is the Philadelphia area's newest community orchestra. Its membership consists of a select group of professional and avocational musicians who attend weekly rehearsals and participate in a series of concerts each year. Its flexible instrumentation allows the investigation of repertoire from chamber-sized to full orchestral works. The Independence Sinfonia has several more concerts ahead this season, including appearances with the Delaware Valley Chorale this May. Jack Moore, Music Director of the Independence Sinfonia, is quite active in the Philadelphia area. For 17 years, he was conductor of the South Shore Symphony Orchestra (the former Atlantic Community College Orchestra, where he was an adjunct faculty member). In 1995, he was named Conductor of the Ambler Symphony, and was recently named Principal Conductor of the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia. He attended Glassboro State College, and more recently participated in master classes in Europe. He has appeared in concert with the Hradec Kralové Philharmonic in the Czech Republic, and with the Hermitage Chamber Orchestra in St. Petersburg. Mr. Moore is a classical music announcer at Temple University Public Radio, WRTI, 90.1 FM.
