Gian Carlo Menotti's Opera in One Act

One night in Judea, a lame shepherd boy-turned-beggar tries to tell his mother about what he has seen outside: an enormous star with a long tail. His mother, used to his problem with telling tall tales, grows angry; she is even angrier when Amahl tells her that a knock at the door is three kings come to visit them. The kings enter and tell the two peasants that they have come to find a king, and they show the rich gifts they have brought him. While Amahl's mother is out gathering wood for the fire, Amahl asks the kings questions about their lives, then Amahl is sent out to ask the other shepherds to bring food for the kings, because he and his widowed mother have none to offer. That night, Amahl's mother tries to steal some of the kings' gold to use to help her sick child. She is caught, but the kings offer to let her keep the gold, explaining that the king they seek will need nothing but love to rule his kingdom; she returns it. Amahl offers his staff as an additional gift, and suddenly finds that he can walk. Amahl pleads for his mother to let him join them, and he is allowed to follow the kings to Bethlehem to adore and give thanks to the Christ child, who has healed his leg.

Susan Rheingans (Stage Director) marks her directorial debut with this production of Amahl and the Night Visitors after receiving experience as an assistant director for productions of La Boheme, Cavalleria Rusticana and I Pagliacci. It is appropriate that Ms. Rheingans should begin her directing career with this opera, an icon of 20th Century American classical music, since her singing career has encompassed much contemporary music, including several commissions of new solo vocal music and more than a dozen premieres of solo works in the United States and Europe. Ms. Rheingans' operatic experience includes work with such diverse opera companies and directors as Goetz Friedrich and the Deutsche Oper Berlin, Christopher Alden and Long Beach Opera and Jim Wiest and Connie Koppe and Delaware Valley Opera Company. Ms. Rheingans is on the voice faculty at Settlement Music School and maintains a busy private voice studio in Fairless Hills, PA. Upcoming vocal engagements include a recital on January 26, 2007 at Settlement Music School (Main Branch), and two concerts with the Newtown Chamber Orchestra on February 24 and 25, 2007.

Spotlight

Timothy Oliver (Kasper) has performed the role of Kaspar at least fifty times and, as one of his favorite roles, he is looking forward to the next fifty. He has portrayed over forty different operatic roles and has been featured by many area orchestras. His recent performances include Ralph Vaughn Williams' "Hodie" with the Susquehanna Valley Orchestra in Sunbury, PA, Orff's "Carmina Burana" for the City of Hope Foundation in the Kimmel Center's Verizon Hall and the Williamsport Symphony Orchestra, Christian in Herbert's "Red Mill" with the Rose Valley Orchestra, and Remendado in Bizet's "Carmen" for the Delaware Valley Opera Company. He holds a BA in Music from Lycoming College.

Elizabeth Oliver (Amahl) is pleased to mark her fifth season playing the role of "Amahl." Though written to be sung by a child, the role is dear to her heart, as it brings to life the childlike joy and profound meaning of the Advent season. The coloratura soprano has been performing regularly in the Philadelphia area since 1997 with such organizations as the Lancaster Opera Company, the Delaware Valley Opera Company, and the Philadelphia Singers. Other roles in her repertoire include "Rossina" in The Barber of Seville, "Josephine" in H.M.S. Pinafore, "Madame Goldentrill" and "Miss Silverpeal" (on separate occasions!) in The Impresario, and "Frasquita" in Carmen. She is happy not only to sing regularly with her husband, Tim, but to work side-by-side with him as well at Cunningham Piano Company, one of the city's oldest piano dealers.

Gabriel Gordon (Music Director/Conductor) is the Music Director of several Community and Professional orchestras in the Tri - state area, including The Old York Road Symphony, and The Independence Sinfonia. Mr. Gordon is the Assistant Director of the Strings International Music Festival featuring members of the Philadelphia Orchestra. Reviews have been unanimously positive, as Classical New Jersey and many others say, "Watching and listening to the maestro lead the orchestra is a treat in itself. Every gesture has a clear purpose, is significantly nuanced and is explicitly observed by the musicians." As one of the founding members of the DaPonte String Quartet, he spent ten years honing his musical craft in the art of Chamber Music. "I am is a much better conductor for having spent those years in a string quartet." Rather than just beating time and giving orders, he feels a conductor is much more like a chamber music partner with the orchestra. This creates an amazing connection between the conductor and the players. New Jersey's Star Ledger confirms this by writing, "Mr. Gordon has a wonderful rapport with his musicians."
