

Jerome Rosen, Music Director & Conductor



Jerome Rosen graduated from the Curtis Institute of Music with an Artist's Diploma in violin and from the Cleveland Institute of Music with a Bachelor's in Music. As an apprentice conductor he worked with George Szell, conductor of the Cleveland Orchestra,

and with James Levine.

Maestro Rosen spent a 40 year career as a member of some of the world's leading orchestras, from which he retired in 1999. He has also held the position of Concert Master of the Boston Pops, Associate Concert Master in the Detroit Symphony and has been a member of the Cleveland Orchestra, the American Symphony Orchestra and the Festival Casals. Mr. Rosen's piano experience includes rehearsal accompanist for the Cleveland Orchestra Chorus under Robert Shaw. He has had solo violin performances with the Cleveland Orchestra, the Detroit Symphony, the Boston Symphony and the Boston Pops.

In he leisure time, other than music, Mr. Rosen's interests include mathematics and philosophy, computer science and poetry.

Dr. William Fullard, Soloist

William Fullard's career on the clarinet began because he wasn't good enough to play the trombone...the favorite instrument of his grade school instrumental teacher. He credits his first teacher, Henri Baron (Sousa and Prior Bands), with inspiring him in this life-long pursuit of music. He has also studied with Joseph Allard (NBC Symphony), Donald Montanaro (Philadelphia Orchestra), James Kilik and Jo-Ann Sternberg. He is the co-founder and principal clarinetist of the Independence Sinfonia located in suburban Philadelphia and an active chamber musician in Philadelphia. Together with a number of members of the Independence Sinfonia he attends the Bennington Chamber Music Conference each summer.

A graduate of Haverford College he received his PhD from the University of Pennsylvania add was awarded a USPHS Postdoctoral Fellowship to Yale University. He is Emeritus Professor of Educational Psychology at Temple University.
